



A condiment set by William Elliott of four pieces made in London in 1820 and crested with an elephants head out of a Ducal Coronet adopted improperly by Lt Governor Davey.



The crest on the condiment set with the incorrectly engraved trunk down:



A fork from the Davey canteen. The crest from this fork engraved with the trunk down.





Fairbairn's Crests, plate 93, illustrates the correct form of crest for Davy Crest 13 with the trunk up as it should be.



A pair of tea spoons commissioned in Sydney before Davey's departure from the convict Walter Harley, circa 1819/20. The kangaroo mark is of the greatest interest and the spoons are monogrammed A (unknown) T (Thomas) D (Davey) the crest also incorrect with the trunk down.
