



COMMENTS ON PROPOSED PARKS AND WILDLIFE SERVICE LICENCE

Red Bill Point Conservation Area

Parks and Wildlife Service

The Parks and Wildlife Service is proposing to enter into a licence for part of the Red Bill Point Conservation Area with the owner/operator of the Beauty Point Tourist Park.

The purpose of the licence is to address present management issues for both the Parks and Wildlife Service and the Beauty Point Tourist Park.

The proposed area to be covered by the licence is described as "being from protracted lines off the southwest boundary of the tourist park, along West Arm Road on the southeast and then along West Arm on the western and eastern boundaries of the tourist park to Red Bill Point".

While vehicular access is to be restricted, public pedestrian access will be retained. The licence will introduce a higher level of management, providing an improved amenity for visitors to the tourist park.

Subject to rezoning the licence will allow for additional campsites as an expansion of the tourist park, with predetermined areas being retained as public space.

Comments about this proposal will be accepted until **Monday 12 October 2009**.

DEPARTMENT of JUSTICE

Tasmanian Electoral Commission Vacancy Member

Expressions of Interest are sought from individuals who are interested in making a valuable contribution to the democratic process in Tasmania by serving on the Tasmanian Electoral Commission in the position of member.

The Member of the Commission will be expected to have an interest in, and understanding of, the Tasmanian community and its democratic traditions. A detailed knowledge of electoral systems is not necessary.

All positions on the Commission require strict political neutrality. Under section 8 of the *Electoral Act 2004*, a person is ineligible to be appointed if that person is, or has been, in the period of 5 years immediately preceding the date of appointment:

- a Member of a House of Parliament of the Commonwealth or a State or Territory; or
- a member of a party that is registered under the Electoral Act or under an Act of the Commonwealth or another State or Territory as a political party or a member of a similar organisation.

Appointment is by the Governor for a period of up to 7 years and is remunerated. The Commission meets quarterly with additional meetings as required, for example, when parliamentary elections are held.

Parole Board Membership

Member of the Parole Board

Expressions of Interest are invited from suitably qualified persons for appointment as a member of the Parole Board. The Parole Board has the authority to:

- grant parole;
- defer making a decision on whether a prisoner should be released on a parole order;
- refuse to release a prisoner on a parole order.

Applications for this position are invited from any person who has practised as a legal practitioner or barrister of the Supreme Court or any person who is qualified and experienced in matters associated with mental health, forensic psychology, sociology, criminology, penology or medicine.

Appointment is by the Governor-in-Council for a period of 3 years. Members receive a stipend paid quarterly; currently this is \$19,703 per annum. Currently meetings are held fortnightly.

Deputy Member of the Parole Board

Expressions of Interest are invited for appointment as a deputy member of the Parole Board. The Minister determines the period of appointment of persons to be deputy members of the Board.

A deputy member is entitled to attend a meeting of the Parole Board if a member is absent from that meeting and, is taken to be a member of the Board. The Chairperson of the Board may nominate a deputy member to fill that vacancy. Deputy members receive pro-rata payment for attendance.
